INQUEST IN LEICESTER

A SAD END

Walter Capewell, aged 29, a shoe pressman, of 121 Halkin Street, met with an accident at his work a short time ago, several of his fingers being cut off. Since then he has been greatly depressed. On Wednesday he was found in the front room of his house with a severe wound in the throat, evidently inflicted with a carving knife. The wound was bandaged by a policeman and the poor fellow taken to the infirmary. He died the same night. He leaves a widow and a small family. At the inquest on Thursday Dr. Rogers said death was due to asphyxia and hemorrhage, due to the cut, and a verdict of "Suicide whilst of unsound mind" was recorded.
